Geo4NIEM is an OGC initiative named Geospatial Enhancements for the US National Information Exchange Model (NIEM). Working from a scenario in which a hurricane strikes New York City, the initiative's technology provider participants will show how enhanced geospatial capabilities enable situational awareness through the ability to identify, process, and comprehend critical information about an incident. OGC Geo4NIEM Initiative technology provider participants include OGC members Galdos, The Carbon Project, Luciad and ArdentMC. In the demo, specific Information Exchange Packages (IEPs) from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) are implemented using widely employed open standards to support rapid and flexible communication of geospatial information in cross-community information exchange domains such as public safety, emergency management and maritime operations oversight. After the webinar, a detailed Geo4NIEM OGC Engineering Report will be made available to the public on the <u>OGC Public Engineering Report website</u>.

Did you know that ...

The Web Coverage Service standard, WCS allows the exchange of geographic information as hedges. That is, special information representing space-time variations of a phenomenon, for example, a digital terrain model, a satellite image, information about simulation systems, etc.. The OpenGIS ® specification is structured into a core document, which defines the basic requirements to be met by any WCS standard and moreover defined extensions describing additional requirements and response coding. Recently the <u>WCS Working Group</u> has published the <u>WCS standard</u>



documentation with coordinate reference systems extensions, attribute extraction, scaling and interpolation. The following <u>link</u> describes the latest version of WCS 2.0: operations providing service and some examples.

Given the considerable demand for training for public officials, researchers, teachers, students, allied professionals and users of the Spatial Data Infrastructure of the Pluri-national State of Bolivia (in Spanish IDE-EPB), <u>GeoBolivia</u> undertakes the task of designing an introductory course on Spatial Data Infrastructures (SDIs), the use and applications of IDE-EPB. To date, an official IDE-EPB

<u>geoportal</u> version 1.0 is available, which is its first node. The course will cover main concepts of SDIs, its components and purposes, thus will appeal to anyone managing geographic information or making use of the IDE-EPB services. GeoBolivia structured a <u>course schedule</u>, so as to develop one in each capital city of nine departments in the country.

BRAZIL

Ministry of Health started publishing data in INDE

Last August began operating the "node" of the Ministry of Health (MOH) in the National Spatial Data Infrastructure of Brazil (in Portuguese INDE). The MOH published information such as the percentage of investigated infant deaths, primary care coverage, annual parasite incidence of malaria, and the percentage of deaths in women of childbearing age, among others. These indicators are used to monitor the agenda of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), a series of macro-objectives established by the United Nations (UN). Available new maps service "SIRGAS IGM Points" on Chilean geoportal

Among the initiatives to achieve geographic information interoperability for the State, the Chilean map layer Geoportal viewer has now linked the "IGM SIRGAS Points." The new layer is located in the "Topography" category and comes from the Military Geographic Institute (in Spanish IGM) servers. This points' layer shows the reference frame for all geodetic and cartographic activities and representation, and is composed of geodetic points created, calculated and materialized by IGM. The points are used to develop mapping and to increase density of other geodetic networks with multiple purposes (mining, urban forestry, other). The National Statistics Department (in Spanish DANE) launched to all its users and the general public its new corporate website including the novel release of its Geoportal http://www.dane.gov.co/geoportal/, which is the institutional dissemination tool of the Geostatistical Information System (in Spanish SIGE). The SIGE is DANE's institutional GIS. This system has been evolving for 20 years with three major stages or phases. First stage began with the National Census of Population and Housing 1993 including the use of digital mapping; second stage was the general census of 2005, which used mobile geographic technologies, GPS, and web map viewers. Currently, DANE is taking steps towards the third generation of SIGE. The new geoportal is the georeferenced statistical information instrument for all. organizations: both municipalities that must be interconnected to the system, and other organizations and public bodies that are users of the cadastral database / registry, and optionally private users." (p.2)

"Article 1 – Establishment of the National Territorial Information System, that may be called for short as SNIT, as a system that advertises and publishes in a comprehensive way, thematic territorial information that is properly georeferenced, standardized and made compatible to base land information consisting of the official cadastral and topographic mapping, generated in a first step from ortho-photogrammetric surveying, surveying and mapping by the Cadastral and Registry Regularization Program at different scales, as well as aerial ortho-photography, satellite images, and any other type of media it deems the National Register .

Article 2 - The SNIT has overall objectives to promote the generation of products, services and georeferenced geographic information covering national, regional and local levels, to publish in an integrated and georeferenced ways territorial information produced by public bodies and institutions as well as private or legal individuals, and to homogenize standardized geospatial information in the context of a common data infrastructure." (p. 3)

LaCad is Represented in the Conference Land Administration Domain Model (LADM) FIG 2013 Source: Andrea Carneiro by way of Silvane Paixão

Researchers of the <u>Laboratory of Cadastre and Land Management (LaCad)</u> of the Federal University of Pernambuco (in Portuguese UFPE), Brazil, Department of Cartographic Engineering, had articles accepted in FIG 2013 LADM Conference. The papers present the development of LADM for the urban cadastre (Arapiraca experiences and Republic of Cape Verde, Africa), and modeling the regularization process of indigenous lands. This latest survey was conducted in collaboration with members of the <u>Integrated Spatial Analytics Consultants (ISAC)</u>, India and the <u>University of Twente</u> (ITC), The Netherlands. The model LADM was approved in November 2012 and became part of ISO



19152 in December 2012. It is a standard for modeling of cadastral systems, based on international models. The accepted papers represent the first experiences of its application to Brazilians. The LaCad-UFPE demonstrates its pioneering with monitoring the development of ISO and simultaneous development of studies to analyze the feasibility of its application in Brazil, hence the importance of these publications:



Panama: First high-resolution national carbon map

A team of researchers has for the first time mapped the above ground carbon density of an entire country in high fidelity. The researchers integrated field data with satellite imagery and high-resolution airborne LiDAR data to map the



vegetation and to quantify carbon stocks throughout the Republic of Panama. The results are the first maps that report carbon stocks locally in areas as small as a hectare (2.5 acres) and yet cover millions of hectares in a short time. The system has the lowest demonstrated uncertainty of any carbon-counting approach yet-a carbon estimation uncertainty of about 10% in each hectare overflown with LiDAR as compared to field-based estimates. Importantly, it can be used across a wide range of vegetation types worldwide. The new system, described in Carbon Balance and Management, will greatly boost conservation and efforts to mitigate climate change through carbon sequestration. It will also

inform our understanding of how carbon storage can be used to assess other fundamental ecosystem characteristics such as hydrology, habitat quality, and biodiversity.

Ground-breaking Climate Risk Management Tool Launched in the Caribbean Source: Arturo Brun-Martinez



The Caribbean Climate Online Risk and Adaptation TooL (CCORAL), a web-based tool designed to help decision makers in the Caribbean integrate climate resilience into their decision-making and planning processes, has been launched in Saint Lucia. CCORAL was developed by the Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre (CCCCC) and Acclimatise, based on a thorough consultation process involving significant input from across the region. Critical inputs have been provided by Government Ministries in the four CCORAL pilot countries (Barbados, Belize, Jamaica and Suriname), non-governmental and civil society organisations, business and financial services sectors, universities and research institutions, and development partners. The new online support tool is an important step towards increasing the climate resilience of the region. CCORAL is an online, open-source tool which can be accessed here: http://ccoral.caribbeanclimate.bz/. It guides users through several steps, helping them to quickly identify whether their activity is likely to be influenced by climate change and is a priority for further investigation, understand climate influence at each stage of their activity, and take action to increase climate resilience.
